Insurance	The Sir John Monash Centre has public liability insurance.

Sir John Monash Centre Safety Policy	The Sir John Monash Centre has a Work Health & Safety Policy recognising its responsibility and obligations, as outlined in the <i>Work Health and Safety Act 2011 (Cth)</i> and under the French Labour Code, to create and maintain a safe and healthy environment for all workers and other persons on the Australian National Memorial site. Visitors to the Sir John Monash Centre have a shared responsibility for their own safety and the safety of others.
Emergency Procedures	All Sir John Monash Centre staff hold First Aid Certificates (French PSC1 qualifications) and are trained to deal with emergency situations. An emergency alert and evacuation tone system is installed in the Sir John Monash Centre. In case of an emergency, Sir John Monash Centre staff will advise and direct all visitors of appropriate action. This includes coordination of ambulances and other emergency services.

Incident Reporting and First Aid	Sir John Monash Centre management is committed to maintaining a safe environment. Incident reporting by the public is encouraged in order to identify and address hazards.
	If a teacher or student experiences an accident, injury, or near-injury during their visit to the Australian National Memorial site, we ask that the teacher in charge report this to a Sir John Monash Centre staff member as soon as possible. All staff members and volunteers are trained in first aid procedures.
	Heal
	Access to and egress from the Sir John Monash Centre premises are safe and without risk to health.
Accessibility	The majority of the Australian National Memorial site is wheel chair accessible. A notable exception is the Australian National Memorial Tower, which is only accessible by stairs. Ramps are provided for entry to the Orientation Building and the Sir John Monash Centre.
	Accessible toilets are located in the Orientation Building by the car park, and in the Sir John Monash Centre on the basement level, which can be reached via an accessible passenger lift. Toilets for the general public are also available in these locations.
	All audio will be heard through headphones so there will be no need for a hearing loop.
	Subtitles/transcripts are available for the hearing impaired
	Whilst visiting the Australian National Memorial site, teachers are responsible for the full supervision of their students at all times.
Student supervision	The minimum supervisory ratio is one accompanying adult to fifteen students.
	All staff at the Sir John Monash Centre undergo a police character and criminal record check as a part of the recruitment process.
Climate of northern France	Average low-high temperatures in the region range from between 2-7°C in January and 13-23°C in August.
	Rainfall in Villers-Bretonneux is significant. On average, there is rainfall on 20 days per month from September-January, totalling an average of 72mm per month. February is the driest month, but still experiences 17 days of rain on average, totalling 49mm.
	A rain coat and/or umbrella and appropriate warm clothing is recommended.
Other requirements	Staff and students are advised to wear flat, non-slip footwear to enable ease of movement through the cemetery, up the stairs of the Australian National Memorial tower and across all gallery floor surfaces inside the

Sir John Monash Centre including stairs, steps and ramps. All visitors are
required to wear footwear whilst in the galleries.
